

Graduate Students, Tuition Waivers & Library Work

Graduate students working in the library are not eligible for tuition fee waivers.

The starting salary for graduate students working in the library is \$6.90/hour. The library does not meet the Office of Graduate Studies required \$10/hour rate. Library graduate students are not classified *graduate assistants*. In this capacity library graduate students are **NOT** eligible for tuition fee waivers from the library.

Graduate students classified as *graduate assistants* in other units who work more than 20 hours per week on campus may not work in the library.

Graduate students working in another campus unit at the \$10 rate and classified as a *graduate assistant* can work in the library at the \$6.90 rate only if their total hours worked in both units combined is not more than 20 hours/week (.5 FTE). If the library is asked by the Human Resources department to reclassify a student from library clerk or assistant to *graduate assistant*, the library would be required to pay that student \$10/hour. In that case the library will not be able to continue employing that graduate student.
