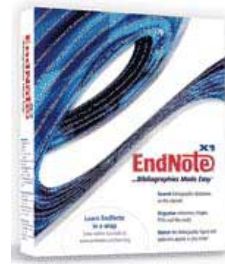


## University of Central Florida Libraries

The 2 most popular citation management programs are Endnote and RefWorks. Both have similar features; EndNote requires a download and RefWorks is web-based requiring a login and password.

Citation Management Programs help researchers:

- collect citations from online Resources (including the UCF Databases and online catalogs)
- Organize references
- Create bibliographies
