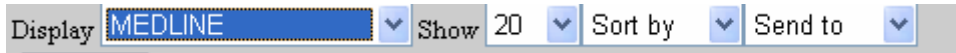


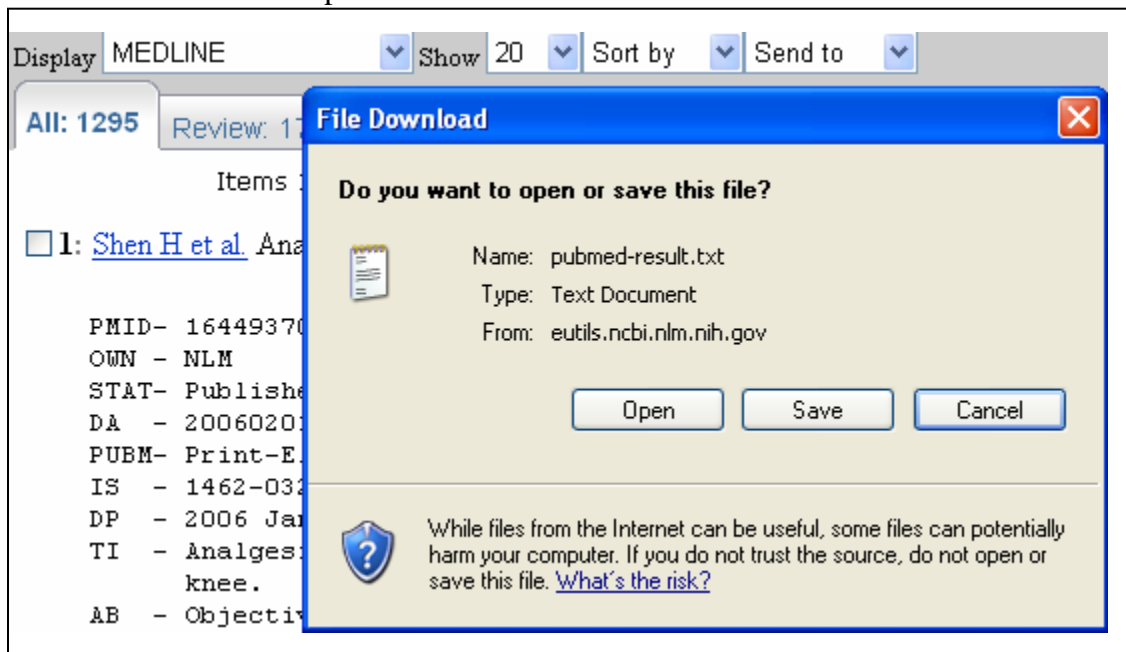
Importing Citations from PubMed into EndNote

IMPORTANT: If you are using *EndNote 7.0* before importing files from PubMed into EndNote, you will need to delete the old PubMed filter file from your computer and download a new PubMed filter into EndNote. The old PubMed filter file should be in your C:\Program Files\EndNote\Filters folder. The new file is available here: <http://www.endnote.com/enpalert.asp>. Save this new file into the same location as the old one, and then complete these steps:

1. Select citations from PubMed to import by checking the box to the left of the citation number. If you want to gather citations from several searches to import, go to step 2. If you want to import citations only from this one results list go to step 3.
2. If you want to gather citations to import all at once, send the checked citations to the Clipboard by using the Send To button. When ready to import go to the clipboard by clicking on CLIPBOARD just below the search box.
3. Make sure the display option reads MEDLINE. Click on the drop-down box next to the Display button and choose MEDLINE.

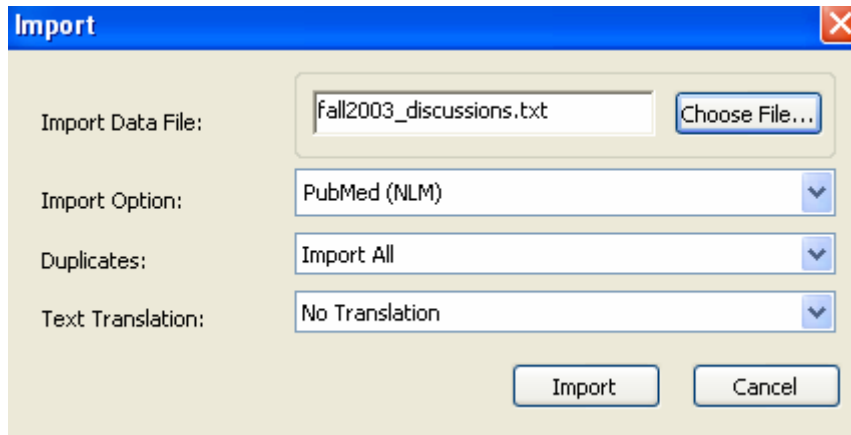


4. From the drop-down box to the right of the Send To button, select File and click on the Send To button.
5. Click SAVE and name the file with a .txt extension. Example: cites.txt. Saving the file to the Desktop makes it easier to locate the file.



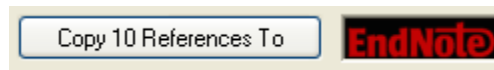
6. Open EndNote.
7. Click on File and Import.

8. Under Import Option, use the pull-down menu to select PubMed (NLM).
9. Click on Choose File and select the file to import. Click on Open.
10. Click on Import.



Another Note: You can also search PubMed through the Endnote Program or use Medline from the libraries' list of databases. To search PubMed through Endnote:

1. Open your Endnote Library.
2. Under the TOOLS pull-down menu, select CONNECT and then CONNECT again.
3. In the alphabetically listing highlight PubMed (NLM) and click CONNECT.
4. This will open a Remote Connection to PubMed. The search screen is not as detailed as the web version, but you can still find references for your research.
5. Once your search results download, simply highlight the reference(s) you want to add to your Endnote Library.
6. In the upper right-hand corner you will see the references being added. Once you have highlighted all the references you need, click "Copy References to"



7. Choose the library you would like these references saved to and it will automatically open this library and display your references.
8. When you close the remote search window this message will display, just click OK and close the search box again.
