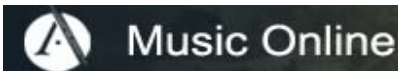
NEWS YOU CAN USE FROM YOUR UCF LIBRARIES

How well do you know the Library Databases?

You probably know that the "Articles and Databases" link on the Library home page is great for finding those scholarly journal articles you need to complete that research paper, but... did you know that a whole range of other materials are available to you? For example, check out the following databases:



Theatre in Video lets you download video performances from 250+ of the world's leading plays & more than 100 documentaries. Videos available include performances of *King Lear*, *Long Day's Journey into Night*, and many more.



Classical Music Library/Jazz Music Library provides more than 50,000 audio tracks available online in musical genres that include African American, blues, dance, jazz, Latin, rock, and more.



Lexis-Nexis Academic allows you to keep current on world events by searching 1300+ newspapers from around the world.



History Resource Center: U.S. - read the translation of a 1493 letter from Christopher Columbus to Lord Raphael Sanchez reporting on his "successful" discovery of a new route to the Indies and the lucrative spice trade. Many other primary historical sources are also available in this database.
