Among the hospitality titles included are the *Dictionary of Hotels, Tourism and Catering Management* and *Oddbins Dictionary of Wine*.

A Slice of Food History at the Library



Come join us in the Library as we host the exhibit The Making of a Zuckerbäcker: Apprenticeship and Tools of an Austrian Pastry Baker from January 9th through March 17th, 2006.

The exhibit invites you to travel back in time to learn about the apprenticeship of a pastry chef in 1950s Austria, to a time of baking with the hands and with traditional tools, to a time of careful methods and delicate pastries – of a sort to be found today in only the finest European pastry shops.

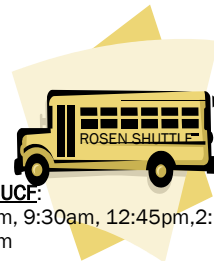
The items on display – pastry tools of the era, trade school drawings, official apprenticeship documents, and more – are on loan from Rosen's own Dr. Wilfried Iskat, who completed a traditional baking apprenticeship in Austria from 1954 to 1957 and later worked as a Zuckerbäcker (literally, a "sugar baker") in the world famous Demel pastry shop in Vienna.
