

Accessing the Wall Street Journal

This guide explains how to access the *Wall Street Journal*, which is available online to UCF students, faculty, and staff. For more assistance, come see us in person, visit our website below, or call us at 407-903-8100.

Navigating to the *Wall Street Journal*

Step 1 – Start at the **Rosen Library Home Page** (<http://library.ucf.edu/rosen/>)

Step 2 – Click on the *Helpful Websites* link

Step 3 – Click on the *News Sources & Newspapers* section heading

Step 4 – Click on the *Wall Street Journal from ProQuest* link

If you are working off-campus, you may be prompted to enter your **Library ID Number** (found on your UCF card) and Password (the last 4 digits of your PID) to verify you are affiliated with UCF.

Searching for Articles

1. In the search box, you can type in keywords relating to your topic. You may also type in an article title or author, if known.
2. You may use the options in the date range drop-down box to search for articles by specific date or by date range.
3. Click *Search*.
