

Electronic Books

An electronic book is the same as the printed version of the book, except that the complete, full text of the book is available online. The UCF Libraries purchases selected electronic books and lists these books in its online catalog for the convenience of UCF students, faculty, and staff.

Finding Electronic Books Using the UCF Library Catalog

Let's say you are looking for books about event planning. If you search for *event planning* in the UCF Library Catalog (available from the Rosen Library homepage), a portion of your results may look something like this:

The first record listed is an electronic book, indicated by the E-book icon 

You can access an electronic book from the library catalog by clicking on the **blue hyperlink**. The book will open in the appropriate database or website, where you will be able to read the book in its entirety or navigate to specific chapters using the search tools provided. Printing and saving capabilities will vary by database.
