**Browsing** – Circulating books on the MICE industry are *generally* found in the following ranges:

- AS6s (general, special events, meetings)
- G155s (general, event tourism) and GT3403 – GT3406 (general, event planning)
- HF5718 – HF5735, especially HF5734.5 (meeting planning, event planning)
- T391 – T396 (trade shows, expositions) and TX911.2 – TX911.3 (conventions, conferences)

**Library Catalog** – Through the **UCF Library Catalog**, you can locate books, journals, audiovisuals, government documents, and many other types of materials.

## Finding Articles

**Browsing Periodicals** – The following periodicals are available in print and may contain helpful information about the MICE industry. To find articles on a specific topic, you may need to use one of our databases. A  denotes a scholarly (peer-reviewed) source.

**Databases** – To find articles from journals, magazines, and newspapers about your topic, you may need to use one of UCF's many databases. To find databases that are typically most useful for the study of hospitality, click on the *Database Locator* tab on our homepage ([library.ucf.edu/rosen](http://library.ucf.edu/rosen)), and then choose the subject *Hospitality*. Some useful databases for MICE research include:

- *Hospitality & Tourism Complete*: Includes scholarly research and industry news relating to all areas of hospitality and tourism, with coverage from the 1960s to the present.
- *Leisure Tourism Abstracts*: Indexes journals from the fields of leisure, recreation, sport, hospitality, tourism, and culture, with coverage from the 1970s to the present.
- *ABI Inform*: A general business database that indexes articles on marketing, economics, corporate strategies, management, products, and more, with coverage from the early 1900s to the present.
- *Business Source Premier*: A general business database that indexes articles in business, management, economics, finance, and more, with coverage from the 1960s to the present.
